





What happens when our buttons get pushed?

Usually, three things can occur:

- 1. We become reactive. Our brains go to "survival of the fittest" mode. Or our brains begin to repeat those dreaded lectures that we may have experienced from our childhood years.
- 2. We demonstrate the skill that we are trying to eliminate. We may grab a toy away from a child while saying, "I said don't grab your sister's toy."
- 3. We feel guilty. We realize later we have been reactive and done something that causes us to feel guilty. That feeling of guilt can cause us to become permissive. (i.e. Your child has whined all evening that he wants cookies. You tell your child "No cookies." The whining goes on until you lose your cool and scream, "I told you, no cookies. Go to your room." When calm is restored, you begin to feel guilty. You go to the cabinet, get the cookies and take them to your child.)

What is a helpful strategy to use when our buttons get pushed?

- Take three deep breaths before opening our mouths.
- Repeat, "I'm safe, I'm calm, I can handle this."

Developing this skill will take a willingness to change old thoughts and patterns. It will also take practice and patience. We can do it! And our children can, too!

What have we taught our children when we practice this strategy?

- 1. We stop and breathe before we respond, thus helping to encourage use of words vs. a physical reaction.
- 2. We demonstrate a skill that we want our children to imitate.
- 3. We feel empowered, thus helping our children to feel empowered.
- 4. We model respect.

FOOD SAFETY

Thank you for your diligence in keeping our children safe by observing and honoring the "nut-free" rooms.

For the safety of <u>all</u> children, the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC) standard 5.B.02 says:

"Food that comes from home for sharing among the children must be either whole fruits or commercially prepared packaged foods in factory-sealed containers." Please let your child's teacher know if you plan on bringing a special snack or birthday treat to school.

Wash, wash, wash your hands...

Just a reminder that children must wash their hands before entering the classroom each morning. Accompany your child to the bathroom and let him/her show you the "proper" way to wash.

This will help keep germs at bay and protect against allergic reactions.

NEW SECURITY MEASURES

The staff at First Presbyterian Church and the Weekday School is committed to providing a safe and secure environment where optimal learning can take place. Based upon recommendations from the Weekday School Security Committee, the following safety procedures will be implemented:

- All exterior church doors will remain locked during school hours. Personnel will be in place at the doors during the following times in order to accommodate arrival and dismissal:
- 1. 8:45 9:15
- 2. 12:45 1:00
- Families are welcome at other times. However, in order to gain access to the building, please call the Weekday School office at 662-7588 and someone will meet you at the door.
- All classrooms as well as the Weekday School office and the church office have a walkie-talkie so that communication can
 occur in case of any emergency.
- Classrooms are equipped with removable blackout shades to be used ONLY if there would be a need to secure children safely in place inside the classroom.

Additional Security Measures to be installed soon:

- A new buzzer system for the Weekday School to be located at both the front and back doors.
- A security camera will also be located at the front and back doors.
